

## **'Catch Up' Funding**

The literacy and numeracy catch up premium gives schools additional funding to support Year 7 pupils who did not achieve at least level 4 by the end of KS2. All state funded schools with year 7 pupils receive this funding. In the financial year 2015-16 schools received £500 for each pupil in year 7 who did not achieve at least level 4 in reading or Maths by the end of Key Stage 2.

The funding can be used in the following ways;

- Individual tuition
- Intensive small group tuition
- External services and materials
- Summer schools that help students catch up over a short period of time

For the academic year 2015/16 the Academy received £15,500. The funding was spent in the following ways;

- Individual tuition in Maths
- Literacy catch up (synthetic phonics/specialist dyslexia interventions)
- Additional support from the Ethnic Minority and Traveller Achievement Service (where relevant)

Literacy intervention	£10,000	62% of students within the programme have made good progress (tracked through reading age data and 'ratio gains' formula applied to determine this)
Maths tuition	£3000	72% of the cohort met their end of Y7 Maths target
Additional EMTAS provision	£2500	Teacher assessment data for individuals represents good impact for this provision (assessment data analysed for subjects where additional support has been purchased)
